The fertile fields of Peroguarda and Alfundão, irrigated with water from the Alqueva dam, support the development of modern agriculture that is profitable and competitive both economically and in terms of employment. chance to discover the Church of Alongside the traditional cultivation of cereal crops, new crops are emerging such as table grapes, olives and almonds, which add new shapes and colours to the agricultural landscape.



The municipality of Ferreira do Alentejo is located in the Lower Alentejo, exactly halfway between the Atlantic coast and the border with Spain. With an area of 648.25 km2 and a population of 7,850, the municipality has a strong focus on agriculture, in the form of both traditional cultivation of olive trees and the cork oak forests of the montado, and modern cultivation using irrigation. There are traces of occupation by humans since the Middle Palaeolithic, with the region being used throughout all the periods of pre-history and history.



CONDUCT AND SAFETY

This trail is reserved for walkers only. Walk in a group; avoid going alone. Wear a hat and suitable clothing and footwear for your intended walk. Take a backpack with plenty of food and water. Be respectful of public and private property. Leave gates and barriers the way you found them. Avoid using plastic items and dispose of rubbish in the proper places. No naked flames or lighting fires of any kind. Make use of local services for overnight stays, meals and shopping.


MICHEL GIACOMETTI FAL MW Walking Trails of FERREIRA DO ALENTEJO. PORTUGAL





14 km Loop 4 to 5 hours

This is a distinctly agricultural region between the traditional villages of Peroguarda and Alfundão, where the different types of large-scale production can be found. The landscape varies between fields of cereal crops in their different colours throughout the year, traditional irrigated crops characterised by an abundance of green in the summer, and finally fields for the intensive farming of table grapes, and olive and almond plantations.

DESCRIPTION OF THE TRAIL

The trail is circular and can be started in either of the villages, Peroguarda or Alfundão. As it is a tribute to Michel Giacometti, our suggestion is that you start in Peroguarda, where he asked to be buried. Set off from the Civil Parish Council, head in the direction of the Church of Santa Margarida (St Margaret), passing by a stone monument, the Padrão dos Centenários. Turn left after the church into Rua Dom Diogo Passanha and then turn right into Rua Professor Joaquim Roque. At the end, turn left and go as far as the fountain, and then turn left again into Rua Francisco Sevinate Pontes. Turn left into Rua 25 de Abril and then turn right into Rua de Lisboa. After leaving the village, turn immediately right onto a rural track, crossing a small bridge over the river. After slightly more than a kilometre of agricultural fields, interspersed with traditional olive groves, you reach a tarred road; go straight on and turn left at the first junction. After the end of the tarred stretch of road, turn right, turn left and then turn right again and continue alongside olive plantations and then agricultural fields. Turn left next to the small building used for the irrigation system and, after crossing the stream, turn right towards the village of Alfundão, following the rural track parallel to the road. In Alfundão, turn right into Rua Joaquim Inácio and then right again into Rua Longa. At the end of the street, turn right towards the "Roman Bridge" and cross it. Go past the public wash-house and continue along Rua Dr Aires da Fonseca and Rua do Ouro. After the Civil Parish Council, turn left along Rua da Igreja, where the Main Church of Our Lady of the Conception stands, with a number of Visigoth remains. Leave Alfundão on the right hand side of the cemetery and start crossing the fertile agricultural fields, with fields of cereal crops, large-scale olive plantations and huge almond plantations, which you go around to the right and then cross until you come to another enormous olive plantation in straight lines. After about 1,700 metres, turn left until you cross, with the greatest of care, the tarred road and see the vineyards growing table grapes, perfectly arranged on trellises covered with protective nets and with modern irrigation and control systems. Continue as far as the road leading to the village of Peroguarda, which is located on the left, passing the cemetery where Michel Giacometti is buried.
